Dear Mr. Speaker and Mr. President:


This is to inform you that I have signed into law House Bill No. 11-459, cited as the "Parks and Recreation Act of 1998," which was passed by the Eleventh Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature.

I have signed this measure to create a Division of Parks and Recreation within the Department of Lands and Natural Resources and to empower it to oversee the administration of public parks and recreational facilities in the Commonwealth. It also provides for a creation of a special account in which certain funds are to be deposited, and grants expenditure authority for such funds to the Director of Parks and Recreation. For clarification purpose, such funds must still have to be specifically identified and appropriated through the regular process of an appropriation bill before such money could be expended.

There are typographical and mis-numbering errors contained in this bill. For clarification and convenience of the Law Revision Commission, page 1, line 16, section 2 should be section "3", and "\$6291" should be "§ 2691". On page 3, line 27, "§ 2675" should be "§ 2704". Page 4, line 16, section "2" should be changed to section "3".

This bill becomes **Public Law No. 11-106**. Copies bearing my signature are forwarded for your reference.



ELEVENTH NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE

PUBLIC LAW NO. 11-106
H. B. NO. 11-459

FOURTH REGULAR SESSION, 1999

AN ACT

To establish the Division of Parks and Recreation in the Department of Lands and Natural Resources, to provide for the landscaping, beautification, and protection of Commonwealth parks and recreational facilities; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ELEVENTH NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

1 Section 1. Short Title. This Act may be cited as the "Parks and Recreation Act of
2 1998."

3 Section 2. Finds and Purpose. The Legislature finds that the Department of Lands and
4 Natural Resources is empowered to establish landscaping and beautification projects pursuant
5 to Public Law 10-57. The Legislature further finds that the Department of Lands and Natural
6 Resources has enhanced, maintained, and beautified public parks since approximately 1979.
7 The Legislature further finds that the number of public parks managed by the Department of
8 Lands and Natural Resources has increased substantially since 1979 and maintenance of the
9 parks has become increasingly difficult without the power to charge fees, promulgate
10 regulations, and enforce rules. The Legislature further finds that there is currently no single
11 governmental entity charged with the responsibility of constructing, maintaining and repairing
12 community sports facilities. To this end, a Division of Parks and Recreation within the
13 Department of Lands and Natural Resources must be established with the necessary powers to
14 oversee the administration of such parks and recreational sports facilities.

15 Section 3. New Article; Division of Parks and Recreation. Amend PL 10-57 by
16 adding in section 2 after § 6291 a new Article 6 to read as follows:

17 **"Article 6. Division of Parks and Recreation.**

18 **§ 2701. Division of Parks and Recreation.** There is in the Department of
19 Lands and Natural Resources a Division of Parks and Recreation headed by a director
20 serving under the supervision and control of the secretary.

1 **§ 2702. Definitions.** In this Article:

2 (a) "Commonwealth park" means an area set apart and designated as a
3 Commonwealth park by the Division of Parks and Recreation including any
4 public facilities located within the boundaries of the park.

5 (b) "Department" means the Department of Lands and Natural
6 Resources.

7 (c) "Director" means the Director of the Division of Parks and
8 Recreation.

9 (d) "Division" means the Division of Parks and Recreation.

10 (e) "Fund" means the Commonwealth Parks and Recreation Fund.

11 (f) "Recreational facilities" means all public sports and recreation
12 facilities and outdoor sports and recreation areas and fields except for the
13 Gilbert C. Ada Gymnasium and adjoining sports facilities which shall be under
14 the sole management and control of the Northern Marianas Amateur Sports
15 Association.

16 (g) "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Department of Lands and
17 Natural Resources.

18 **§ 2703. Duties.** The Division shall:

19 (a) Have the care, charge, control, and supervision of Commonwealth
20 parks and recreational facilities.

21 (b) manage, maintain, landscape, and beautify Commonwealth parks,
22 and recreational facilities.

23 (c) Erect and maintain structures, signs, and facilities at Commonwealth
24 parks and recreational facilities for the enjoyment of the CNMI residents and
25 visitors.

26 (d) Permit the use of Commonwealth parks and recreational facilities
27 by the public pursuant to rules and regulations prescribed by the Division.

28 **§ 2704. Permits.**

29 (a) The Division may require a person to obtain a permit for the
30 temporary exclusive use of a Commonwealth park or recreational facility. For
31 each permit the Division shall impose:

1 (1) A reasonable user fee to recover the cost of administering
2 the fee system and managing, maintaining, landscaping, and beautifying
3 Commonwealth parks or recreational facilities; and

4 (2) A reasonable security deposit to be retained by the Division
5 to the extent the Commonwealth park or recreational facility is damaged
6 and such damage is caused by the activities of such person during the
7 exclusive use of the Commonwealth park or recreational facility; and

8 (3) Any other terms and conditions deemed proper by the
9 Division.

10 (b) Fees and security deposits retained under this section shall be
11 deposited in the Commonwealth Parks and Recreation Fund.

12 **§ 2705. Rule-making.** The Division shall adopt rules and regulations
13 necessary for the proper administration of its duties under this Article.

14 **§ 2706. Interagency Notification and Coordination.**

15 (a) Any department agency, public corporation, or other instrumentality
16 of the Commonwealth which plans to use, or conduct any activities which may
17 adversely affect, a public park or recreational facility, shall consult with the
18 Director.

19 (b) The Division shall coordinate the parks and recreational functions
20 of the various Commonwealth departments and federal agencies in the
21 promotion of parks and recreational opportunities.

22 **§ 2707. Commonwealth Parks and Recreation Fund.**

23 (a) A Commonwealth Parks and Recreation Fund account shall be
24 maintained by the Department of Finance separate and apart from other funds
25 of the Commonwealth Government and independent records and accounts shall
26 be maintained in connection herewith.

27 (b) All moneys received by the Division pursuant to § 2675 shall be
28 deposited in the Fund.

29 (c) Moneys in the Fund shall only be expended to manage, maintain,
30 landscape, and beautify Commonwealth parks and recreational facilities and to
31 erect and maintain structures, signs and facilities at Commonwealth parks and
32 recreational facilities.

(d) Expenditure authority for the Fund shall rest with the Director upon written approval from the Secretary.

(e) The Director shall provide a yearly accounting of all fees collected under this Act to both the Secretary of the Department of Finance, and the Legislature.

§ 2708. Police Powers.

(a) With the approval of the Secretary, the Director shall designate and provide with official identification one or more employees assigned to the Division as park rangers who shall be vested with police powers to enforce the laws of the Commonwealth and to enforce rules and regulations adopted by the Division at Commonwealth parks and recreational facilities.

(b) The Department of Public Safety shall have concurrent jurisdiction to enforce the laws of the Commonwealth in Commonwealth parks and recreational facilities."

Section 4. Conforming Amendments. Public Law 10-57 is further hereby amended to insert in Section 2 after §2653(m) new subsections to read as follows:

"(n) To manage and operate the Commonwealth Mitigation Bank, as provided by law;

(o) To construct, maintain, and repair recreational facilities as defined in 1 CMC § 2674(g)."

Section 5. Authorization for Appropriation. There is hereby authorized to be appropriated from the general fund the amounts necessary to accomplish the objectives set forth within this Act.

Section 6. Repealer. The provisions of Section 2 in Public Law No. 10-84 are hereby repealed in their entirety.


Section 7. Transitional Clause. Except as provided in this Act, any powers or duties relative to Commonwealth parks and recreational facilities previously charged to any other government entity shall be transferred to the Division.

Section 8. Severability. If any provision of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

1 Section 9. Savings Clause. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be
2 construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes
3 repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained
4 in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The
5 enactment of this Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any
6 liability civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence on the date this Act becomes
7 effective.

8 Section 10. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the
9 Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.


