Notification of the Ministry of Public Health

(No. 232) B.E. 2544 (2001)

Re: Repeal of the Notification of the Ministry of Public Health (No. 14) B.E. 2522 (1979).

Due to the remaining solution from monosodium glutamate production nowadays is not sold directly to consumers but is used as raw material for producing other kind of foods such as sauces, soybean sauces, fish sauces, brine for cooking, etc., in which such foods are prescribed in the notification of the Ministry of Public Health especially in quality or standard, and in conjunction to contaminants which are prescribed in the notification of the Ministry of Public Health No. 98 B.E. 2529 (1986), Re: Standard for foods with contamination, which are sufficiently supported. It deems appropriate to repeal the notification of the Ministry of Public Health No. 14 B.E. 2522 (1979), Re: Prescribed qualities or standards and labels for remaining solution from monosodium glutamate production.

By the virtue of provisions of Section 5 and 6(3) (4) (5) (6) and (10) of the Food Act B.E. 2522 (1979), in which contain provisions in relation to the restriction of Rights and Liberties of the Persons, in respect of which Section 29 and in conjunction with Section 35, Section 48 and Section 50 of the Constitution of the Kingdom of Thailand so permit by virtue of provisions of law; the Minister of Public Health hereby issues the notification as follows:

“The notification of the Ministry of Public Health No. 14 B.E. 2522 (1979), Re: Prescribed qualities or standards and labels for remaining solution from monosodium glutamate production, dated 24th August B.E. 2522 (1979), shall be repealed.”

This notification shall come into force as from the day following the date of its publication in the Government Gazette.
